

SUM ARAB 201: Summer Arabic V

Credit Hours: 6 credit hours

Contact Hours: 95

Course Duration: 1 Summer Term (4 weeks) **All Onsite Locations and Virtual Programs**

Important note: this is a real syllabus for this course, presented primarily in English for administrative purposes and with the course schedule showing coverage during an average summer term. Student placement in an Arabic level is determined by a written assessment prior to arrival, an OPI-style assessment during onsite Orientation, and consideration of prior study. The syllabus learners receive onsite consists of a summer term-specific course schedule presented in Arabic with a detailed, daily listing of in-class activities and homework assignments.

Course Description

This course follows Arabic 104 and builds with specificity on the critical foundation built in the beginning year of language study. It challenges learners to activate increasing amounts of vocabulary while enabling them to use grammatical structures and syntactical cues to enhance their growing vocabulary on their own. The task-based class environment supports the curricular emphasis on Arabic sentence structures and verb forms to develop learners' accuracy in comprehension and production. Learners gain confidence and hone their spontaneity in real-life formal and informal communicative situations. This course covers the material in *Al-Kitaab*, Part Two, Third Edition, Chapters 2-5, as well as local materials and materials developed by instructors.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, students will be able to and/or have mastered and developed the following:

Knowledge

- Increasing familiarity with Arabic's root and pattern system
- Arabic verb forms
- Arabic sentence structures beyond foundational introduction
- Sophisticated strategies for determining the meaning of new words from contexts
- Colors
- Case in Arabic
- Greatly increased vocabulary Increasingly nuanced ideas about Arab culture(s) with focus on both contemporary and historical context

Skills

- Begin to use knowledge of roots and patterns to understand and produce even unfamiliar words and forms
- Variegated precise use of Arabic sentence structures and grammatical constructs
- Increasing ability to comprehend on the basis of context
- Use of increasingly sophisticated skimming and scanning techniques; facility with longer and increasingly complicated texts
- Comprehending longer and increasingly complex authentic material on familiar topics
- Producing longer and increasingly complex writing
- Making informed, formal presentations on topics of interest
- Greater dictionary skills
- Increasing ability to engage in appropriate formal and informal written and spoken communication based on situational context
- Greater spontaneity in initiating and responding in Arabic

Attitudes

- Curiosity about the local culture in particular, with increasing appreciation for its diversity
- Growing confidence in ability to interact with native speakers
- Awareness of positionality that, along with increasing cultural awareness, informs formal and informal interactions

Desire to pursue further study of the language.
